- 1. The pre-test is a way to gauge your baseline knowledge. You are not expected to know all of the answers, so give it your best shot! You will most likely see these questions again during the course!
- Please take the course in sequence. Wake AHEC will be tracking each participant's progress to ensure you complete all units and receive full credit. No partial credit will be awarded for this course.
- 3. Always allow yourself a few extra minutes to complete the quizzes, which are "knowledge checks" at the end of each unit.
- 4. Registration for the NC CD Course will be open continuously. You should however plan to complete the online CD course within 6 months of registration. It is estimated that will take 14 hours to complete. Fourteen (14) contact hours will be awarded for completion.
- 5. After the last lecture and quiz in Unit 14, the evaluation link will be available as the last item in the course. When you complete the evaluation, you will be directed to a form that you will fill out online verifying that you have completed all 14 modules and requesting that Wake AHEC send you the link to the post test. Once you submit the form, you will receive the link to the posttest within two business days. Please allow yourself 1 ½ hours to complete. The post-test is open book, and use of internet resources is permissible as well. We just ask that you do not confer with others while taking the test. Completion with a score of 80 is required to receive credit for the course. If you pass, the certificate will be available to you for download at the end of the test.
